5th DEAFNET AFRICA CONFERENCE

The 5th DeafNET Africa Conference will be held from 21 - 24 November 2022, at the Premier Hotel, Johannesburg South Africa. DeafNET Centre of Knowledge will organise and host the conference. Please take note that the Covid-19 protocols will be followed. The theme of the conference will be: "Capacity building initiatives within the Deaf Communities"

BACKGROUND

The DeafNET Centre of Knowledge (DeafNET) has over the past 16 years provided a platform and voice for networking of knowledge and expertise. Its main objective is to exchange and disseminate knowledge and skills to empower Deaf persons on the African continent, to achieve their full potential through training and development, to take their rightful place in society, to be valued citizens of their country, to advance self-representation and to implementing programs that promote awareness of and respect for D/deaf persons' language and culture.

Building on the successful 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th DeafNET Quadrennial Conference held in 2004, 2005, 2011, and 2016 in South Africa and Swaziland, the 5th DeafNET Africa Conference will be held in partnership with De Stichting Vrienden van Effatha (SVE). This event provides an important space to debate, share best practices and plan how to address the pressing challenges and explore opportunities for working with DeafNET and different country participants to enhance cohesion, sustainability, and capacity for improved livelihoods for Deaf persons.
